Subject	Registration for Persons, Firms and Corporations conducting draft beer line cleaning and Approval of all compounds used for draft beer line cleaning.			Page	1 of 2

The registration of all Persons, Firms and Corporations conducting the business which involves the cleaning of beer coils, barrel tubes, and beer lines is required by 176 CSR 1 Section 8.4.f under the authority of W.Va. Code §11-16-22(b).

The requirement for the approval for all compounds used for cleaning beer coils, barrel tubes, and beer pipelines are required by 176 CSR 1 Section 8.4.b.

All cleaning frequencies, cleaning procedures, and cleaning and/or sanitizing compounds used for cleaning beer coils, barrel tubes, and beer pipelines must meet 64 CSR 17 Food Establishment Rule and 2013 FDA Food Code adopted by reference.

Registration

1. All Persons, Firms and Corporations conducting the business which involves the cleaning of beer coils, barrel tubes, and beer lines shall register with the local health department in the jurisdiction where the person, firm, or corporation is located. This registration shall be on the form provided by the WV Bureau for Public Health or local health department.
2. All Out-of-State Persons, Firms and Corporations conducting the business which involves the cleaning of beer coils, barrel tubes, and beer lines shall register with the local health department in the jurisdiction in which it does the majority of this type of business within the boundaries of the State of West Virginia. This registration shall be on the form provided by the WV Bureau for Public Health or local health department.
3. Licensed Retailers, as stated in 176 CSR 1, who themselves or their designee do their own cleaning shall register with the local health department(s) in the county(s) in which this activity is performed. This registration shall be on the form provided by the WV Bureau for Public Health or local health department.
4. A copy of this registration must be available to the local health department sanitarian or WV Alcohol and Beverage Control Administration inspector upon request.
5. All registrations are effective for two (2) years from the date of the local health department signature.
6. No renewal notices will be sent by the local health department regarding the expiration of this registration.

Cleaning and Sanitizing Compounds

Approval and Use

1. All compounds that are used for cleaning beer pipelines and barrel tubes must be approved for use on food contact surfaces and meet Section 7-202.12 Conditions of Use and Section 7-204.11 Sanitizers, Criteria of the 2013 FDA Food Code.
 - a. Proprietary compound(s) will require documentation that the compound(s) meets the criteria stated above.

2. All compounds must be used as specified by the manufacturer's directions and in a method that meets both 176 CSR 1 Section 8.4.b AND 64 CSR 17 - 2013 FDA Food Code Section 4-602.11(E)(4) and 4-602.11(E)(4)(b) and 4-603.14, 4-603.16, 7-202.12 and 7-204.11.

Compliance

1. All cleaning frequencies must comply with W.Va. Code §11-16-18(a)(7) and 64 CSR 17-2013 FDA Food Code 4-602.11(E)(4)(b).
2. All beer coils, barrel tubes, and beer pipelines must be cleaned and sanitized in accordance with 176 CSR 1 Section 8.4.b and 64 CSR 17 – 2013 FDA Food Code Sections 4-501.17, 4-501.18, 4-501.19, 4-501.114, 4-501.115, 4-603.14, 4-603.15, 4-603.16, 4-702.11, 4-702.11, 4-703.11 and 4-901.11
3. All beer coils, barrel tubes, and beer pipelines surfaces must be maintained in accordance with 64 CSR 17 – 2013 FDA Food Code Sections 4-501.11 and 4-601.11.
4. Design and construction of beer coils, barrel tubes and beer pipelines shall be in accordance with 176CSR1 Section 8.4.c and with 64 CSR 17 – 2013 FDA Food Code 4-101.11, 4-202.11, 4-204.13, and 4-204.16.

Inspections

1. Inspection of all documentation for cleaning of all beer coils, barrel tubes, and beer pipelines will be performed as part of the routine inspection(s) by the local health department as specified in 64 CSR 17 Food Establishment Rule.

Documentation

1. As required in 176 CSR 1 Section 8.4.f.1 record cards shall be provided to the food establishment and available to the representative of the local health department or WV Alcohol Beverage Control administration for review at time of inspection.
